JULY 1, 2021:

WITH THE SAFE-T ACT ILLINOIS ENDS
DRIVER'S LICENSE SUSPENSIONS
FOR UNPAID FINES AND FEES FROM
TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS AND
AUTOMATED CAMERA TICKETS.

Your driver's license can NO LONGER be suspended for:

- Failure to pay parking tickets
- Failure to pay traffic tickets
- Failure to pay red-light camera tickets
- Failure to pay vehicle compliance tickets
- Failure to pay automatic speed camera tickets
- Failure to pay abandoned vehicle fees

The Act also reinstates driving privileges for those who have already had their driver's license suspended/revoked for failing to pay these tickets. Reinstatement is free, automatic and will occur by July 1, 2021.

The law **does not** eliminate any outstanding ticket debt. You must still pay off your tickets, but your license will no longer be suspended due to the debt.

Over 80% of Illinoisans drive to work and data shows that up to 42% of individuals lose their jobs following the suspension of their licenses. Over 10,000 Illinois drivers currently face license suspensions due to unpaid automated traffic violation fines, alone.

As of July 1, 2021 Illinois will no longer suspend licenses for any ticket fines or fees. On February 22, 2021, Governor Pritzker signed HB 3653 SFA2: the SAFE-T (Safety, Accountability, Fairness and Equity – Today) Act. It goes into effect July 1. The Secretary of State estimated as many as 500,000 license holds could be lifted as a result.
